

WINE STYLE PROFILE

ow has a grape whose name translates to "little green" become an increasing presence in Maryland winemaking? Petit Verdot, a grape that grows reluctantly in multiple countries across the world, seems to have found its home in our state. As one of the five approved grapes (Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot) that can be used in Bordeaux red wines, Petit Verdot - a relative of Cabernet Sauvignon - has typically been used only as a blending grape. Single varietal, or majority blend, bottlings of Petit Verdot have been relatively uncommon, until now.

Petit Verdot produces small berries with thick skins; "little green" refers to its late season ripening. According to the Maryland Grape Growers Association (MGGA), these qualities give it higher acidity than Cabernet Sauvignon, and it adds nice color and complexity in blends. MGGA sees it as "maybe the easiest of the Bordeaux varieties [to grow] in the Mid-Atlantic region." Vineyard manager Ron Wates, of Boordy Vineyards, likes to describe the growing patterns of the grape as "vigorous with a tendency to be rangy."

Petit Verdot can produce intense, big

wines with dark berry and fruit flavors and good structure. Because of this, consider pairing Petit Verdot wines with heartier foods like roasted or grilled meats, hearty vegetables and cheeses. The tannins in the wines also give them the ability to age well.

In fact, two Petit Verdots won prestigious awards in 2015: the 2013 Petit Verdot from Big Cork Vineyards won Best in Show at the Maryland Governor's Cup competition, and Catoctin Breeze's 2013 Petit Verdot "Adagio" won Best in Class Red at the Maryland Winemaster's Choice competition.

You can find Petit Verdot around the state on our Wine Trails, including the Bordeleau NV "Lot Number 1" on the Chesapeake Wine Trail; Port of Leonardtown's 2012 PV Reserve on the Patuxent Wine Trail; Big Cork's 2013 Petit Verdot on the Antietam Highlands Wine Trail; Catoctin Breeze's 2013 Adagio on the Frederick Wine Trail; and Royal Rabbit's "The Viscount" and Boordy's Landmark Reserve 2012 Blend on the Piedmont Wine Trail. ineries, long associated with the pastoral tracts of lands on which grapes are grown, are now popping up in more metropolitan areas. And a new crop of millennial wine drinkers have helped to open that door just a little wider for alternative wineries. No one can deny the beauty of a vineyard, but some of Maryland's best wineries are located right in the city. Here are some of our favorites:

Turkey Point Vineyard

116 SOUTH MAIN ST. / NORTH EAST, MD 21901 TurkeyPointWines.com

In 2007, Eric and Doris Behnke began designing their future vineyard, after inheriting part of the family farm. In 2008 they were up and running, with three varieties in the ground: Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Chardonnay. That was on approximately 5 acres. In the spring of 2014, they added a little over 2 acres to the vineyard, which gives them about 7 acres of grapes (5 in production).

North East is located in Cecil County, at the head of the Chesapeake Bay. With a resident population of nearly 2,000 people, the town is host to thousands of visitors during the summer months. The Turkey Point Vineyard Tasting Room, located on North East's vibrant Main Street, opened in May 2014, and was an instant success. Visit their tasting room to try and buy their award-winning wines!

Cygnus Wine Cellars

This cozy winery and tasting room is located in Carroll County's historic downtown of Manchester. The winery, which was established in 1996, took up

residence in an abandoned 1939-vintage slaughterhouse.

Owner and winemaker Ray Brasfield focuses on producing dry table wines and methode champenoise sparkling wines from only locally grown grapes. The focus of the Cygnus Wine Cellars tasting room is wine education. Customers will find intelligent and informative answers to their wine questions, often from the winemaker himself. Events are important at the winery. During the summer, several dinners are featured, where a specially chosen chef will prepare a dinner for twenty guests outdoors. While he prepares the dinner, guests watch the chef and enjoy appetizers. Later they go downstairs where tables with linen tablecloths and crystal stemware are provided for the dinner. When you visit, make sure to ask Ray where the name Cygnus comes from!

St. Michaels Winery

The town of St. Michaels, located in Talbot County, dates back to the mid-1600s when it served as a trading post for area tobacco farmers and trappers. This vintage harbor port, whose origins date from the birth of the colonies, is nestled on the beautiful Miles River, and this is where you will find the charming tasting room at St. Michaels Winery.

This family-owned and -operated winery started in 2005 and is the largest winery on the Eastern Shore, using primarily local grapes. Upon arrival, visitors are given a list of the possible wine flights to taste, along with descriptions. Guests can order a flight, or an individual glass. The winery is located in the Historic Old Mill complex, also home to artists, a floral designer, and other unique shops.

The Urban Winery

Have you ever found yourself in our nation's capital, wondering where the closest winery is? Well look no further than The Urban Winery in Silver Spring. Silver Spring, having recently experienced a significant renaissance, is the fourth most populous place in Maryland. And that reason, perhaps, makes it the perfect place to open a winery!

The Urban Winery just recently opened its doors in June of 2015, in the Fenton Village neighborhood. Years ago, Damon and Georgia Callis would have called wine-making their number one hobby, having made wines out of their Silver Spring home for over 15 years. It didn't take long for that hobby to become a passion, and for that passion to become a business plan. In 2012, Damon and his wife, Georgia, both found themselves disenchanted with their careers, and came up with a plan to open a winery, claiming all they had was passion and a sense of feasibility.

Upon visiting their tasting room, you will not only be able to sample their wines, but wines from all over Maryland. And that's not all – they also feature local beer, cider and mead. One of the goals of The Urban Winery is to increase the awareness of Maryland product overall and to play a part in expanding the public's knowledge and appreciation. So walk, drive, or metro on down to the Urban Winery...you'll be glad you did. Charis Winery 17 HOWARD ST. / CUMBERLAND, MD 21502 CharisWinery.com

Nestled at the base of the Appalachian Mountains is the historic town of Cumberland. And it's there that you will find Charis Winery, which opened its doors in 2013 as Allegany County's first winery. Owners Chuck and Robin Park moved to Maryland about 10 years ago and began making wine. Really good wine, as it turns out! They are located in downtown Cumberland's Canal Place Shops.

Charis Winery (pronounced Kar-is), offers red and white wines, dry to sweet, including a Catawba blend made with Maryland peaches and a recently added Pinot Noir. The Charis Winery Tasting Room is open several days a week, and also offers private tastings by appointment. Tastings are \$7.00 for a flight of seven wines of your choice. You receive a \$5.00 discount with the purchase of two or more bottles of wine. Charis Wines are sold under the Charis and Charis Reserve brands of wines at the winery and at wine shops throughout Maryland.

Olney Winery

Originally a Montgomery County winery, Olney Winery boasts a wide array of different wines to appeal to every palate. Hands down, this winery has the most diverse selection of wines from which to choose. In doing so, they are able to ferment over 30 different varietals of wine, bringing "the world of wine to Maryland," as they say.





- butter for the pan
 ½ baguette, cut into 2-inch slices
 ½ small yellow
- onion, thinly sliced
- ¼ pound thinly sliced cooked ham
- 6 ¾ cup white wine
- 6 ½ teaspoon black pepper
- 1½ cups (6 ounces) grated Gruyère



DIRECTIONS

- Heat oven to 400° F. Place the bread in a buttered ovenproof skillet, a 9-inch square baking dish, or a casserole. Scatter the onion and ham over the bread. Pour the wine over the onion and ham and sprinkle with the pepper and Gruyère.
- 2. Bake until the cheese has melted and begun to brown at the edges, about 20 minutes. Spoon onto individual plates.



Maryland wine. Vino 301 provides



Leslie grew up in Prince George's County and recalls, Southern Maryland's evolution from tobacco fields to a thriving metropolitan area. She is conversant on Southern Maryland's rich history and discusses the changes to wine tours to her tour guests. "Out of towners are surprised by the transformation in such a short span," concluded Leslie. A significant attraction for Southern Maryland is the desire for the community to preserve its natural treasures, such as its countryside and waterways.

"I love all things wine and especially love local vineyards," revealed Leslie. She continued to explain, "I always look for the local wine section when I visit local restaurants or wine stores. This motivation and passion is a driving force behind the success of Maryland wine. Café des Artistes

WHEN CHEF LOIC JAFFRES DECIDED to open Leonardtown-based Café des Artistes in 1999, the large food distributors would not deliver that far south in Southern Maryland. So Chef Jaffres did what many chefs had not yet started doing in our region: he got together with some other local chefs and had a meeting with local farmers to start buying relationships that continue to this day. Produce, eggs, foraged mushrooms, cheese and meats are just some of the examples of local products that Jaffres purchases from local farms. And that relationship also extended to local wines. While the wine list spans the globe, Maryland wines from Fiore Winery, Slack Farms and Port of Leonardtown are also featured on the list, both by the glass and bottle.

Described as a "classic upscale bistro where you can escape the culinary mundane and take a journey to the French countryside," the café offers the promise of a moderately priced, truly elegant country French meal. Outside the restaurant, a quaint cobblestone patio is perfect for open-air dining, and is "extremely popular during summer 'First Friday' events and Sunday Brunch." The inside décor resembles a country inn, with classic, crisp earth tone tablecloths, and a softly lit dining room. Enjoy live piano every Friday & Saturday, as well as jazz cabaret twice a month. The restaurant also hosts periodic wine dinners, and offers a private dining room for events.
